What is perching:

- It's a compromise between standing and sitting
- The pelvis is slightly tilted forward, which opens the hips and chest
 - Facilitates a more neutral overall posture (neutral spine posture)
- This in turn helps reduce lower back pain
- Restores core strength which had been lost when sitting in a normal chair
- Perching is a getaway into more movement
 - it's a hybrid posture which makes it easier to stand up and move around
- One possible disadvantage is that more pressure is put on the legs and feet
- The idea is not to perch all day but to change positions more freely to make the body feel as comfortable as possible for as long as possible
